

SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS
March 2010

Applications for the following local scholarships are now available in the guidance office. Check over the list to see if there are any for which you might be eligible. Pick up and submit all applications by the deadline date. (March 31, 2010 to the guidance office). Please see Mrs. Schaeffer for applications.

1. Boyertown Ambucs Scholarship Fund

- a. The purpose of this award shall be to encourage attendance at a four-year college by a student who will be enrolled in a program training them to be therapists in the fields of Occupational, Physical, Music, Recreational or Speech & Hearing therapy.
- b. This award shall be made to a student who shows financial need; who has the scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education; who has been accepted to a four year accredited university or college and plans to pursue a career in the therapy field.

2. Boyertown Area Education Association Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of this award shall be to encourage attendance at a four-year college by a student who has the desire to become a teacher and has successfully completed the requirements for graduation from Boyertown Area Senior High School.
- b. This award shall be made to a student who shows financial need; who has the ability to indicate success in higher education; who has been accepted at a college; who shows responsible citizenship and character; and who has participated in some sort of extra-curricular activity.
- c. The student must have attended Boyertown Area Senior High School a minimum of one year.

3. Boyertown Elementary School – PTO Scholarship

- a. This award shall be made to a student (s) who shows need, has scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education, and who shows responsible citizenship and character.
- b. Scholarship(s) will only be awarded to a former Boyertown Elementary student.

4. Boyertown Junior Woman's Club Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to assist 2 students who are pursuing post-high school education and are successfully completing the requirements for graduation from Boyertown High School.
- b. This award shall go to students whose ability indicates success in higher education, who have been accepted by a school for post-high school study, and who have demonstrated responsibility of citizenship and character by participation in an extra-curricular activity and by maintaining an acceptable scholastic record.
- c. Priority will be given to a child of a past or present member of the Boyertown Junior Woman's Club in good standing.

5. Boyertown Area Key Club/Kiwanis Club Student Memorial Scholarship

- a. This award is designed to provide recognition and financial assistance to a Boyertown Area Senior High School Key Club member in good standing who has achieved academic success, demonstrated leadership abilities and has provided service to others. Must be a graduating senior and Key Club member for at least one year.

6. Boyertown Woman in Life Science Scholarship Fund

- a. This scholarship is to be awarded to a female Boyertown Area Senior High School senior who intends to pursue a major in biology or the health related fields. Preference will be given to students who intend to pursue a career in veterinary science; however, students who intend to pursue majors in medicine, dentistry, microbiology, biological research, medical research, or environmental studies are also eligible.
- b. Applicants must have obtained a grade point average of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 scale in high school.

7. Colebrookdale Elementary School Parent-Teacher Association Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to encourage attendance at an institution of higher learning (not necessarily college) by a student satisfactorily completing the requirements for graduation.
- b. This award will be made to a student who shows need; has scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education; shows responsible citizenship and character.
- c. Recipients must have attended Colebrookdale Elementary School for a minimum of one year, excluding kindergarten.

8. Earl Elementary Parent-Teacher Organization Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to encourage attendance at an institution of higher learning (not necessarily college) by student(s) satisfactorily completing the requirements for graduation at the Boyertown Area Senior High School.
- b. Two awards will go to students who have a financial need, whose scholarship record indicates success in higher education, and who have demonstrated responsibility of citizenship and character by participation in extra-curricular activities.
- c. Recipients are to have attended Earl Elementary School.

9. Gilbertsville Elementary Home and School Association Scholarship

- a. This award shall be made to a student who shows need, has scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education, and who shows responsible citizenship and character.
- b. Scholarship will only be awarded to a former Gilbertsville Elementary student.

10. Richard Grabert Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of this award shall be to encourage Boyertown Area Senior High School Vocational-Technical students to further their education.
- b. This award shall be made to a student who shows financial need; has scholastic ability to complete their chosen education; is accepted by the school of their choice; has demonstrated responsibility of citizenship; has successfully completed the Career-Tech program requirements.

11. Frank & Amanda Hartman Educational Foundation

- a. Any students residing in Bovertown, Colebrookdale, Douglass-Berks, Douglass-Montgomery may avail him/herself of these funds for furthering their education.
- b. Applications are available between **April 15th** and **May 17th** from the Education Center on Montgomery Avenue. **APPLICATIONS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE EDUCATION CENTER BY MAY 17TH**.

12. Francis J. Kehs Memorial Scholarship Award

- a. This award will be awarded to a graduating senior who plans to attend a trade school in the field of auto mechanics after high school.
- b. The student recipient must be a senior, accepted to a trade school, have financial need to pay for their educational costs and be in good academic standing.

13. The Tony Klaver Memorial Scholarship

- a. The Tony Klaver Memorial Scholarship will be awarded annually to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a trade, technical, or business school education after high school.
- b. The student recipient of the scholarship must be a senior; accepted to a trade, technical, or business school; have financial need to pay for their educational costs; be in good academic standing; and evidence a likelihood of completion of their chosen post-secondary educational program. When all these criteria are equal, financial need will be the deciding factor.

14. Music Scholarships (same application for A, B, D, and E)

A. Boyertown Alumni Marching Band Scholarship

- a. This is a \$500.00 award is given to any music student. You need not to be continuing in music to apply.
- b. This will be given out at the Music Banquet not at the Senior Awards program.

B. Boyertown Area School's Music League Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to assist students who are preparing for a career in music education, music performance, or a music-related field.
- b. This award will be offered to a graduating senior who has attended Boyertown Area Senior High School for a minimum of one year. The student shall have demonstrated talent in an instrumental or vocal music area; have shown a capacity for academic achievement beyond the high school level; have participated in a school-related extra-curricular musical activity; have been accepted in an accredited music program; and shown responsible citizenship and character.

C. Margaretta R. Lamb Scholarship

- a. The purpose of this award is to provide scholarship money to deserving students at B.A.S.H., who plan to continue their education in choral music.

D. Arlen R. Saylor Award

- a. The purpose of this award is to assist a student who fully intends to pursue further study in a career in music education or music performance.
- b. This award shall be made to a student who has shown a capacity of academic achievement beyond high school level, shown talent in instrumental music, participated in the school band program, been accepted in an accredited music program, demonstrated responsible citizenship and character.

E. Charles W. Weiser Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to assist a student who fully intends to pursue further study in an orchestral career in music education or music performance.
- b. This award shall be made to a student who has shown talent in instrumental music, shown a capacity for academic achievement beyond the high school level, participated in the school orchestra program, been accepted in an accredited music program, demonstrated responsible citizenship and character.

F. Boyertown Choral Award

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to assist students who are preparing for a career in music education, music performance or music-related field.
- b. This award will go to a student who shows talent in vocal music, academic achievement.
- c. Must have participated in the high school chorus.
- d. Must be accepted in an accredited music program.

15. John H. Kauffman III Scholarship

- a. This scholarship will be available to students of Boyertown Area School District who will be furthering their education after high school.
- b. The selected individuals will be students who exhibit a strong commitment to academics and unwavering dedication to their extracurricular school or community activities.
- c. Must be in the top 30% of their high school graduating class.

16. Robert F. Mace Scholarship Fund

- a. The purpose of this fund is to provide a scholarship to a student who will be furthering their education after high school to a two or four year college or university.
- b. The award will go to a student who has a financial need, who exhibits a strong commitment to academics and unwavering dedication to their extracurricular school or community activities.
- c. Must be in the top 15% of their high school graduating class.
- d. Preference will be given to students intending to major in journalism or pre-law.

17. New Hanover-Upper Frederick PTCA Scholarship

- a. The applicant must have attended New Hanover-Upper Frederick Elementary School for at least three full years.
- b. The award will go to a student who has a financial need, whose scholastic record indicates success in higher education, and who has demonstrated responsibility of citizenship and character by participation in extracurricular activities.
- c. Applicant must be planning to attend some form of post secondary education, be it a college, university, or technical school.
- d. Application received without the short resume will not be considered.

18. Pine Forge Elementary School PTA Scholarship

- a. The purpose of this award shall be to encourage attendance at an institution of higher learning (not necessarily college) by a student satisfactorily completing the requirements for graduation from Boyertown Area Senior High School.
- b. This award will go to a student who has a financial need, whose scholastic record indicates success in higher education, and who has demonstrated responsibility of citizenship and character by participation in extracurricular activities.
- c. Recipients are to have attended Pine Forge Elementary School for at least one year.

19. George V. and Dorothy M. Prutzman Family Scholarship

- a. The purpose of this fund is to provide scholarships to seniors who will be furthering their education after high school to a two or four-year college or university as well as a trade or vocational school.
- b. This award will go to a student who has demonstrated a significant service contribution to their community, church or school. The spirit of this scholarship is to reward unselfish young adults who recognize the value of volunteering their time and efforts in order to satisfy a greater community need.
- c. Recipients must rank in the 25th percentile of their high school class.

20. The Henry K. & Evelyn K. Reitnauer Scholarship

- a. The purpose of this award shall be to afford to graduates of Boyertown High School financial aid to pursue a collegiate study program in special education or a related field of study.
- b. The award shall be made to a student who shows financial need; who has the scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education; who has been accepted to a post-secondary educational program; and who plans to pursue a course of study in special education or a related field.
- c. Any special education student (s) planning to further their education may also apply for this scholarship. Said applicant must have had an active IEP while enrolled at Boyertown High.

21. Leidy-Rhoads Foundation

- a. Any students **residing** in the **Borough of Boyertown** may avail him/herself of these funds for furthering their education.
- b. Applications are available **between April 15th and May 17th** from the **Education Center on Montgomery Avenue.** **APPLICATIONS MUST BE RETURNED TO THE EDUCATION CENTER BY MAY 17TH.**

22. Thomas "Breezy" Ruppert Memorial Award

- a. This award is to assist a student who is planning to further his education beyond the high school level. To qualify, the recipient must have participated in the Boyertown Midget/Mite Football Program for each year he was eligible. The recipient must also have participated in an organized football program for each year he was eligible up to and including his senior year of high school .
- b. The award will be a one time award for \$500.00. The recipient must attend an accredited two or four year college, vocational, or technical school and at the time of the award live in the Boyertown Area School District.

23. Sassamansville Fire Company Engine Room Scholarship

- a. This award will be awarded annually to a graduating senior who plans to continue in the fire or ems field either volunteer or career after graduating from high school.
- b. The student recipient of the scholarship must be a senior currently active with either a fire or ems company for a minimum of 1 (one) year prior to graduation.
- c. Student must have a financial need to pay for their education costs, and be in good academic standing.

24. Science Scholarships (same application)

A. The Alan Gerner Science Scholarship Award

- a. The purpose of this award is to assist a student who is a second-year chemistry student, or if a second-year chemistry student does not exist, the award will go to a graduating senior who has had a first year chemistry course.
- b. Academic achievements, character and overall school involvement will be considered as part of eligibility. Need is not a major factor and will be considered if all the other attributes are equal.

B. The George M. Sell Award

- a. This award is presented to a student who plans to further his/her education in any branch of science.
- b. Academic achievements, character and overall school involvement will be considered as part of eligibility. Need is not a major factor and will be considered if all the other attributes are equal.

C. Haunted Science Lab Scholarship

- a. This award is presented to a student who plans to further his/her education in any branch of science.
- b. Academic achievements, character and overall school involvement will be considered as part of eligibility. Need is not a major factor and will be considered if all the other attributes are equal.

25. Tri-County Chamber of Commerce

- a. This award is presented to a student who plans to further his/her education in business, or a vocational or professional field.

26. Washington Elementary School HSA Scholarship

- a. The purpose of the award shall be to encourage attendance at an institution of higher learning (not necessarily a college) by a student satisfactorily completing the requirements for graduation from the Boyertown Area High School.
- b. This award shall be given to a student who has scholastic ability to indicate success in higher education; and who shows responsible citizenship and character.
- c. All candidates are to have attended Washington Elementary School.

27. Carl A. Yescavage Scholarship Fund

- a. The purpose of this fund is to provide scholarships to students of the Boyertown Area School District who will be furthering their education after high school and intend to do so in the areas of elementary education, music education, or physical education. Further education may include a four-year or two-year college or university.
- b. This award will go to a student who exhibits a strong commitment to academics and a dedication to their school or community activities. They should set a good example for their fellow students at all times and show good leadership potential. This scholarship is also based on financial need.
- c. The recipients should be in the top 25th percentile of their high school graduating class.

DEADLINE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS TO BE RETURNED IS MARCH 31, 2010 unless otherwise noted on scholarship application.
