These goals connect directly to our Kindergarten report card. We utilize a 4, 3, 2, 1 grading system. Remember this key phrase:

"A '3' is where you want to be!"

Students who demonstrate consistent achievement of our second trimester learning targets in math, reading, and writing will earn a '3' in those areas.

Students who are able to demonstrate their learning beyond these targets will earn a '4.'

Students who struggle to consistently demonstrate the targets will earn a '2,' and those who are unable

to attain the targets will earn a '1.'
