- These clubs are for the full year and are two days per cycle unless otherwise indicated.
- Clubs that are four days per cycle can be for two days if a student is in band or orchestra.
- Clubs are for students in grades 6-8 unless otherwise indicated.

6th Grade Vocal Ensemble (By Audition Only) – All Year – Days 2 & 5 – Mrs. Rutt

• This select group of 6th graders will collaborate to learn fun and challenging music. Students will be selected for this ensemble based on an audition, and the songs learned in Vocal Ensemble will be performed by the group at the winter and spring concerts! **Grade 6 Only.**

Bear Ambassadors – All Year – Days 1 & 3 – Mrs. Hartzman & Mr. Kalejta

• Calling all future 8th grade students! Become a Bear Ambassador and help us create a supportive community! As a student leader, you'll collaborate with peers and staff to assist others through meaningful service. Ready to make an impact? See Mrs. Hartzman or Mr. Kalejta for an application. **Grade 8 Only.**

Bear Buddies - All Year - Days 1 & 3 - Mrs. Baylor

 An awesome opportunity to create meaningful friendships and opportunities for students with autism spectrum disorder by pairing with peers throughout the West building. This club will aim to foster friendships with others by working together on activities such as games, crafts, daily living skills, employability skills and much more. Let's create an inclusive school environment and a culture of acceptance and understanding.

Math Counts - Trimesters 1 & 2 -- Days 1 & 3 - Mrs. Jakoby - Days 4 & 6 - Mrs. Parish

• Math Counts will be a challenging and fun club for advanced math students. We will complete a gold level project and prepare for a county competition at PSU-Berks. Some of what we will do includes on-line math games, working alone and with teams on challenge problems, competing with classmates in math games and going against classmates in a countdown round.

MSW News - All Year - Days 2 & 4 - Mrs. McDonough

• Members of this club will learn what it takes to be part of an on-air news crew while learning basic interview, research, and reporting skills. Daily responsibilities include script writing and content creation for students and staff. Time management, self-discipline, and independence are needed while working in this large group setting. All creative minds welcome. **Please Note**: All applicants will be required to submit a writing sample in order to be considered.

Select Crafts - Trimesters 1 & 2 - Days 4 & 6, Trimester 3 - Days 1 & 3 - Mrs. Harner

• Students will have the opportunity to use their creativity and problem-solving skills for making art. Most (but not all) art created will be in three-dimensional form, such as: weaving, coiling, mosaics, batiks and more. Some artistic ability is required but creativity is key. Application required. **Grades 7 and 8 only.**

Student Council - All Year - Days 2, 5, 6 - Mr. Hazel & Mrs. Shelly

• Student Council members represent the student body by helping to share students' ideas and interests. They also plan various activities and events for the school. Events include dances, socials, sporting events, food drives & more! Student Council is looking for individuals who want to enhance their leadership qualities and play an active role in their school. **Grades 7 and 8 only.**

Tech Op: Stage Crew – All Year – Days 1 & 3, or 4 & 6 – Mr. Stallman

• As a crew member, you will be operating behind the scenes to help make school events go off without a hitch. Examples of events may include but are not limited to: MSW music concerts, some elementary school concerts, morning announcements, MSW musical, MSW one act plays. Members will be needed before school and after school for practices and shows. Dates and drop off and pick-up times for events will be provided in advance. Technology Student Association (TSA) – Days 1 & 3, 4 & 6, or 2 & 5 – TBA & Mr. Stallman

• The Technology Student Association (TSA) is an international student organization devoted exclusively to the needs of students interested in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). Students are required to pay a membership fee to cover the costs of membership at the state and national level and to cover their costs of participating and lunch at the Regional Conference held at the beginning of February. Students prepare for such events as VEX Robotics, PA Robotics, Co2 Dragsters, Website Design, Video Game Design, Off the Grid House Design, Computer Aided Design, Medical Technology Issues, Prepared Speech, Dragster, and Invention and Innovations. You can look at the national website (www.tsaweb.org) and state website (www.patsa.org) for more information on the 56 events available. TSA is an academic competition club that competes at the regional and state level. After-school participation is a must. Work sessions will be also be held after school 1 to 2 days a week from October to February from 2:55PM-5:00PM in rooms 63 & 64. If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Stallman.

West Music Crew – All Year – Days 1 & 3 – Mr. Bekesy

• Bring in your instrument of choice, let's play some music together! We practice, learn from each other, and maybe write songs together. The last few years we have been able to form a rock band to perform in front of the whole school! You do not have to be good at your instrument to join, just bring it in and slowly get better! Performing on stage is not mandatory.

Youth and Government (YAG) – All Year – Days 1 & 4 – Ms. Laugerman

- Do you like to debate current issues in the world? This may be the club for you! Youth and Government (YAG) is a social studies enrichment club partnered with the YMCA. Students learn and participate in the complexities of state government, including but not limited to:
 - Researching, developing, and writing a bill
 - Formal debate using Parliamentary Procedure
 - Public speaking
 - Collaborating with Lobbyist Organizations
 - Arguing a legal case

NOTE: Students attend several field trips on weekends per year, including a 4 day & 3-night trip to Harrisburg for Model Convention in April where students debate with others across the state in the Pennsylvania State Capitol. * There are program and trip fees involved in this club. Grades 7 and 8 only.

Yearbook - All Year - Days 1 & 4 - Mrs. Marshall

• Yearbook is a small club that works on the layout and production of the West yearbook, *Ursa Minor*. Students applying for this club should be self-motivated, hard-working, detail-oriented, and deadline-oriented. Yearbook staff members will be taking and uploading pictures and designing and editing assigned pages (including checking names and spelling). Students must be able to stay after school from time to time to take pictures at sporting events and practices. Mandatory after-schoolwork sessions will also be held from time to time to ensure that we meet our deadlines (34 pages are due in January; 34 pages are due in March; 4 pages are due in April). Students in yearbook cannot be shared with another club on days 1 & 4.

- These clubs are trimester in length (1/3 of the school year) unless otherwise indicated.
- These clubs do not require an application.
- Clubs are for students in grades 6-8 unless otherwise indicated.

Board Games – Trimesters 1, 2, 3 – Day 1 – Mrs. Reinhart

• Students will learn the rules of various board and card games such as Sorry, Battleship, Uno, Life, Yahtzee, etc. and then have time to interact while playing the games in groups to encourage strategy, good sportsmanship, friendly competition, camaraderie and making new friends.

Chess & Checkers Club – Trimesters 1, 2, 3 – Day 6 – Mr. Bliss

Community Artists Club – Trimesters 1, 2, 3 – Days 1 & 3 or 4 & 6 – Mrs. Stamm

• Are you able to stay focused and do 4 or 5 of the same things? Are you willing to donate some of the items you make to help others? Do you want to learn to sew and do other crafts? Cross-Stitch Club – Trimester 2 – Day 2 – Mrs. Grabner

• Interested in learning a new craft? Cross-stitch club will teach you the art of cross-stitch by following a pattern and sewing little x's into fabric. To be successful, all you need to do is count and follow some basic steps. We will start with the basics of cross-stitching and work on creating some practice patterns to learn the skills. You will also work to create your own basic design and stitch it during the trimester!

Drama Club – Trimesters 1, 2, 3 – Days 1 & 3 – Mrs. Painter

• In this club, students will learn about gardening and gain hands-on experience with starting plants and flowers from seed and transplanting them to the school courtyards when the weather gets warm. Students will gain environmental awareness and learn about how a pollinator garden supports plants that supply nectar and pollen to a wide range of pollinators, including insects such as bees and butterflies and certain birds and animals. This club encourages innovative thinking and collaboration in a safe, enriching environment to create and play. Join the Lego club to meet new friends and to have fun building together.

Muggles & Magicians - Trimester 2 - Day 1 - Mrs. McDonough
