- Anonymous
- Statewide Initiative (Funded)
- Question areas on violence, bullying, drugs & alcohol and depression
- Results received in May 2014

Why did BASD participate in PAYS?

- Finding root causes of problems
- Youth reporting on their own experiences
- Ability to use information to help set District priorities
- Use information to connect District & Community resources
