- As a member of this club, you will be meeting during tenth period. You must be in good academic standing and not require a lot of remediation during the week. We work on projects and presentations and need everyone to be able to be involved in our club.
- Students may be removed from a club at any point in the year if they do not meet the club eligibility requirements.
- Involvement in these clubs may require additional time beyond the school day. Please review the description and requirements on the club description form before applying.
- All of these clubs have a limited number of students that can participate. If you are selected for one of the service/academic clubs, you will not have one of the other clubs added to your schedule until everyone has at least one club on their schedule.
- You may apply for more than one club but will most likely only be assigned to one service/competition club.

An application must be submitted for EACH club in which you want to be a member.

6th Grade Ensemble (Grade 6 only)

Ensemble is a select vocal group selected from members of the Chorus that meets10th period, 2 days per cycle, for the entire school year. You must be enrolled in Chorus 6 to audition and participate in this club.

Art for Humanity (Year: Grade 8 only)

This is a community service art club. In this club students would create artwork that would be donated to charity or create artwork that would be sold and the profits would be donated towards charity. Activities would include a variety of mixed media. More than just making, this club would also explore the charities in which they are helping and investigate the issues that the charities address.

Math Counts Club

Students should excel at math to sign up for this club. This is a competition club for 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. The goal of the club is to prepare for the Math Counts Berks County competition in February of 2023. We will work as individuals and as a team to solve fun and challenging problems. We will also do competitions against each other. Not all students will move on to the county competition but everyone will have fun learning and challenging their brains.

Stage Crew

Students will learn how to produce on-stage productions for Middle School East. Students will learn stage lighting and sound techniques used for our school's assembly programs, concerts, and shows. Members of stage crew assist with concerts, assemblies, and the musical production (anything that happens outside the school day in the auditorium).

Student Council

Student Council organizes events throughout the year that build school spirit and enhance student's middle school experience. Activities range from dances, spirit days, to activity nights throughout the school year. Highlighted annual events are Bear-A-Thon, a fund raiser for the Make-a-Wish Foundation, and the 8th Grade Dance, a mixer with Middle School West students. Interested students must complete an application and elections are also held to determine who will represent the student body.

Technology Student Association (TSA)

Students compete in a variety of technologically based events to further their education. Students use machines, tools, materials, and processes. TSA provides an opportunity to develop leadership as well as scientific and social skills. Members will be required to stay after school to prepare their projects and presentations for the local and state TSA competitions.

Yearbook Club

Yearbook club will produce the 2022-23 yearbook. Students will work on choosing the cover, creating layouts, writing captions, and organizing the eighth-grade favorite section. Students may need to stay after school occasionally to photograph events.

Youth and Government (YAG) (Grades 7 and 8 Only)

Ever wonder what our state representatives and senators do? Do you like to debate? If so, this is the club for you! YAG Club is an opportunity to learn about parliamentary procedure and participate in simulated governmental activities. There are two weekend trips, including a three-day activity in Harrisburg.
