Dear Parents/Guardians and Prospective Grade 9 Students:

Just as you have done in middle school, as a prospective Grade 9 student, you will be required to read a book this summer. The goal of the BASH English department is to celebrate summer reading and to encourage students to develop the habit of lifelong reading.

Accordingly, all BASH students are expected to read at least one book of their choice during the summer. At the beginning of the school year, students will participate in learning activities related to their summer reading.

During the summer, BASH students should:

1. Select and read a book(s) of your choice.

This book may be any fiction or nonfiction book that you are eager to read. The book should be selected based on personal interest, recommendations, and reading ability.
