- Identify a reading goal in one of the following areas:
 - Engagement - For example: **time, pages or amount of text, kinds of books**
 - Comprehension
 - **Plot**
 - **Setting**
 - **Character**
 - **Theme**
 - **Main Idea/Key Details**
 - **Vocabulary**
- Create a reading plan - map out your reading plan on a calendar.
- Listen to the book, read the book, and jot your thoughts and ideas in a notebook.

 - Directions
 - Newspapers, Magazines (school appropriate)
 - Closed-captioning on television (must be school appropriate)
 - Board game directions, Video game directions that are printed (must be school appropriate)
 - Junk mail (must be school appropriate) ,Saved greeting cards (must be school appropriate)
