I. <u>**Professional Development</u>** - Mrs. Susan Kinney, Assistant to the Superintendent for Staff Development and Student Intervention</u>

- 1. Budget Impact Statement
 - Research informs us that teacher quality is the single most significant factor affecting student achievement. The professional development portion of our budget, which is approximately \$500,000 per year, provides training and necessary materials to ensure that ALL teachers receive high quality learning opportunities to ensure a quality education for students. Professional development is also provided to administrators, paraprofessionals and classified staff.
- 2. Compliance Issues
 - PDE mandates, all professional staff must participate in 180 hours of professional development every five years. Our paraprofessionals must also acquire 20 hours of professional development every year. In addition, all new teachers must complete an induction program in order to apply for level II certification.

- 1. Budget Impact Statement
 - Technology systems support the core educational and operational functions of the District. We strive to provide students with current and relevant technologies to give them skills for the rapidly changing world. The District's technology budget supports this commitment. Also, as new technologies are developed, new opportunities are presented for gaining greater educational value from our budget expenditures. The District's technology investment for education exceeds \$1 million per year not including support for this technology and administrative operations which totals an additional \$1.1 million in the 2010-2011 budget.
