Academic Updates

Math

We have been working a lot with groups of tens. We are practicing breaking numbers in the teens into two parts and noticing that 13 is the same as 10+3. We have also been working on counting by tens and then counting on to help us with place value. Recognizing how many tens and ones are in a number will help us as we move into addition and subtraction of bigger numbers. We will be moving into



adding and subtracting two digit numbers in the near futures, so it is imperative that the students have a
strong understanding of place value and the value of each digit in a number. We will begin this challenging
concept by adding and subtracting 10 from a larger number and move towards more challenging problems.

Reading



We have recently worked on synthesizing a text, doing things like using story details to retell a story, discussing how a problem was solved, finding similarities and differences in two texts, and determining who's point of view the story is told from, the narrator or characters, and how perspectives can differ between characters in a story. We have also learned how to analyze a text to determine if it is fiction or nonfiction, and we learned about several text features in a nonfiction book such as headings, a table of contents, glos-

sary, index, captions, labels and much more!

Next, we'll revisit predicting and learn how to cite evidence from the text to support or negate our predictions. We will also become reading detectives as we learn how to infer using clues from the text and pictures.

Writing

We just finished up our unit on opinion writing. Next, we will explore several types of poetry. We'll use our senses and what we've learned about visualizing to help us write and will learn about alliteration, similes, and what an onomatopoeia is!



Then, we are going to begin learning how to write informational pieces. We will work hard on writing "How To" Books. The students get to pick something the know how to do and write step-by-step directions that instruct someone else. We will connect this learning to what we know about following recipes or putting together a new toy! The children will also learn more about using sequential terms in their writing such as first, next, then and last.

Science and Social Studies

In science, we are still working on our solids and liquids unit before we begin a unit on living and nonliving things. In social studies next we'll learn about Germany next. We'll learn about symbols of the countries, the geography, government and much more!
